Christmas Bird Count Results

Snow Buntings, Common Redpolls and Evening Grosbeaks were some of the bird species found during the Christmas Bird Counts (CBCs) held in Red Bank/Sunny Corner on December 18 and Miramichi on January 3. Although the Miramichi CBC has been an annual event since 1972 and the Red Bank/Sunny Corner CBC since 2004, the tradition dates back to 1900. Ornithologist Frank Chapman decided to organize an event to count birds as an alternative to the Christmas Side Hunt in which teams counted how many birds they could shoot! Christmas Bird Counts now take place all across North America between December 14 and January 5. The goal of the count is to find and identify as many birds as possible in 24 hours within a 24 km diameter circle. It's a lot of fun and a great way to learn about the hardy birds that are able to spend the winter in New Brunswick. The results of our CBCs are submitted to a provincial coordinator for New Brunswick, and many are entered into a North American database of Christmas Bird Counts through Bird Studies Canada.

There were 29 species of birds sighted and 1,884 individual birds tallied on the Miramichi count. Highlights included a Great Blue Heron (hope this bird is well on his way south now!) and a White-breasted Nuthatch. A Northern Cardinal was seen in Nordin during the count period of December 14 to January 5. The Red Bank/Sunny Corner count had 19 species of birds sighted and 905 individual birds counted. Highlights of this count included a Northern Goshawk seen on the count day as well as Ringnecked Pheasants seen during the count period. Thanks to everyone who made these counts a success whether they braved the elements and trudged through the snow to count birds, or if they counted birds at their feeders from the comfort of home!
